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Globally, ocean-based activities generated over <u>US\$1.5 trillion in</u> <u>economic output</u> in 2010 and were directly responsible for over 31 million jobs, primarily in fisheries, tourism, off-shore oil and gas exploration and port activities.

By 2030, on current trajectories, the ocean's value added is expected to rise to US\$3 trillion, and associated employment to over 40 million.

However, the state of the world's oceans and seas threatens these benefits


According to the World Bank Group (2012), the gross revenues generated by the ocean economy in the Caribbean in 2012 were on the order of US\$407 billion, equivalent to some 14 to 27 percent of the estimated value of the global ocean economy






Figure 1.5. The (Measurable) Ocean Economy of the Caribbean in 2012 is Dominated by Shipping, Tourism, and Oil and Gas Industries
