































































2013: TRANSBOUNDARY DIAGNOSTIC ANALYSES (TDA's, GEF \$)

Weaknesses in governance = root cause of environmental degradation

High levels of fragmentation

Key: creation of coordination mechanism

- "Agreement on core aspects of the CM": 1 Dedicated CLME+ PSC Meeting (Jun 20)
- "Drafting the CM MOU": 4 meetings of the CM MOU Drafting Group (Aug 20; Sep 20; Sep 20; Sep 20)
- "Drafting the CM MOU": 1 online survey + 1 Regional Consultation (Feb 21)
- "Finalizing the CM MOU": 1 Dedicated meeting with Legal Experts from IGO's (Oct 21)
- "Finalizing the CM MOU": 2 Dedicated CLME+ PSC Meetings (Feb 21, Oct 21)
- → 2 Regular (June 18; Feb 21) and 3 Extraordinary CLME+ PSC Meetings (June 20; Oct 20; Oct 21)
- → 8 Meetings of the CLME+ SAP ICM (July/Aug19; Sept19; Mar20; Sep20; Dec20; Feb21; Jun21; Sep21)



new PROCARIBE+ PROJECT (start: second half 2022?)

- Project concept (PIF) proposes to operationalize (and financially support) the (agreed upon) Coordination Mechanism
- PIF submitted to GEF in March 2021, following the successful technical clearance of the Coordination Mechanism MoU text in February 2021
- Project concept note approved at June 2021 GEF Council Meeting
- Already 20+ confirmed participating States & Territories
- GEF grant: USD 17 million. Full Project Proposal to be submitted early 2022

Recommendations and Decisions in relation to the Coordination Mechanism MoU:

Way forward = following steps:

4. PCU to conduct a LANGUAGE RECONCILIATION of the MoU (...) + share with PSC

5. **Prospective Signatories to conduct LEGAL REVIEW** to allow for **MoU FINALIZATION** and opening for signature, **and to submit any comments/recommendations** to the CLME+ PCU **no later than end of April 2021**.

Recommendations and Decisions in relation to the Coordination Mechanism MoU:

Way forward = following steps:

6. PCU to convene a special CLME+ PSC Meeting before the end of June 2021 to finalize and open the MoU for signature.

Subsequently postponed till October 2021 to give prospective Signatories extra time to finalize their legal review and provide their comments

Steps undertaken for Language Reconciliation

March - April

- After the February PSC meeting, editorial corrections submitted by the United States were assessed by the PCU and included in technically endorsed MOU
- Draft MOU shared with regional organisation, OSPESCA, for additional review
- Review of additional editorial corrections to Spanish version considered and included into draft MOU by PCU
- Corrected MOU shared with Steering Committee and observers

May - June

- Additional corrections to Spanish version obtained
- Editorial suggestions reviewed by PCU and incorporated into revised version of MOU
- Corrected MOU shared with Steering Committee and observers



(Legal) Review of MOU

- Draft MOU shared with Steering Committee and observers on 3 March 2021 to allow for the commencement of the final (legal) review, whilst awaiting the finalisation of the language reconciliation assessment
- Draft MoU, with language reconciliation concluded, shared on 24 March. Reminder of 30 April 2021 deadline. Additional Reminder on 22 April 2021
- PSC Meeting postponed following ICM11 recommendation (June 21), due to pending reviews (especially IGO's) → new "deadline" for comments was set as 31 July 2021
- Final Reminder on 16 September 2021 with final (revised) deadline for comments = 5 October 2021
- Final PSC Meeting = 11-12 October (CLME+ Project ends 31 October)
- (in parallel, a consultation process was also run within the ICM)



(Legal) Review of MOU

PCU reviewed comments received (see also next Agenda Sub-Item) and defined approach for addressing comments:

- 1. Differentiate between request for clarifications and requests for changes
- o 2. Question:
 - Is the feedback aligned with the purpose of the final review?
 - Issues with MoU text that may constitute legal obstacles possibly impeding finalization and (opening for) signature
 - Issues with MoU text that may impede the achievement of the CM's objectives
 - Can the issue be resolved by engaging with the concerned party?
 - Does the issue need to be brought to the PSC (or ICM)?



(Legal) Review of MOU

PCU reviewed comments received (see also next Agenda Sub-Item) and defined approach for addressing comments:

- PCU engaged directly with the concerned party (one-on-one): provided clarifications, highlighted nature of the review, helped identifying remaining issues still to be brought to PSC
- PCU facilitated meeting(s) of the Interim Coordination Mechanism, with CM MoU on the Agenda (PCU as ICM Secretariat)
- PCU facilitated dedicated meeting for IGO's, involving their Legal Experts, on 5 October 2021 and in preparation for the PSC
- Proposed MoU amendments emanating from the aforementioned process are being tabled for discussion under Agenda Item 3c during this Meeting



Purpose of the Special Steering Committee Meeting:

- Address any remaining (legal) comments received on the draft Coordination Mechanism MoU text
- Finalize the Coordination Mechanism MoU, and allow for its subsequent opening for signature
- Review and where necessary revise the roadmap towards the operationalisation of the Coordination Mechanism MoU



Last PSC Meeting = Unique Opportunity and Critically Important

- Negotiations have reached final stage. Culmination of many years of hard work:
 - solid background research
 - many rounds of consultations
 - wide-ranging participation
- Opportunity to capitalize on all our collaborative efforts and reach our common goal of enabling the Coordination Mechanism (SAP milestone)
- CLME+ Project: made it possible for the region to count with a PCU that could support this process over 6 years (CLME+ PCU ceases to exist 31 October 2021)



KEY CONSIDERATIONS:

- MoU provides general framework, CM itself defines further details:
 - MoU is not intended to provide all details of how CM will work/what the CM will do
 - MoU allows the CM to commence and enables and empowers the Signatories to fine-tune any aspects not explicitly addressed in the MoU through the CM Steering Group and Executive Group, e.g.:
 - adoption of rules and procedures
 - adoption of CM Work Programmes (fine-tuning of mandate)
 - Goal today: final verification that the MoU text (1) does not contain any (legal) barriers for prospective Signatories to come on board (in due time); (2) will suffice to allow the CM to achieve its objectives. Finalize
- → Finalization of MoU will enable CM commencement and allow Signatories to take ownership
